evident in the later linear b script where the same things were being recorded and analysing the characters used to record them mark cook demonstrates that linear a is middle egyptian written in a form of shorthand used by the later greeks and romans using hieroglyphs that were modified and simplified to be incised quickly and easily in wet clay many of the tablets he reveals are egyptian taxation records based on the tablets he translates and the reinterpretation of egyptian evidence mark cook concludes that new kingdom egypt ultimately came to rule crete for a brief period rewriting what we know of the end of the minoan empire
