the primary focus of the updated second edition has not changed it embraces the narrative or storytelling approach to the study of argumentation the first section introduces readers to rhetorical theorists and their principles these significant contributions to the field of argumentation and debate include aristotles views on audiences and the ethical character of an advocate burkes dramatic theory of communication brockriedes metaphorical image of arguers fishers narrative paradigm mills guidelines for testing the causal correlation perelman and obrechts tytecas conception of a universal audience rokeachs definition of values and toulmins model for developing and analyzing argument claims and his conception of arguments as field dependent hollihan and baaskes discussions of these ideas and their applications are easy to follow unencumbered by technical jargon and illustrated with engaging examples drawn from current and well known historical events the key to the success of this text is the authors ability to show readers how foundational principles of argumentation are used in a variety of real world situations the second section covers specialized contexts such as academic debates courts of law politics business and organizations and interpersonal relationships

activities that stimulate critical thinking and the implementation of the ideas discussed are provided at the end of each chapter

does the existence of evil call into doubt the existence of god show me the argument philosophy starts with questions but attempts at answers are just as important and these answers require reasoned argument cutting through dense philosophical prose 100 famous and influential arguments are presented in their essence with premises conclusions and logical form plainly identified key quotations provide a sense of style and approach just the arguments is an invaluable one stop argument shop a concise formally structured summation of 100 of the most important arguments in western philosophy the first book of its kind to present the most important and influential philosophical arguments in a clear premise conclusion format the language that philosophers use and students are expected to know offers succinct expositions of key philosophical arguments without bogging them down in commentary translates difficult texts to core arguments designed to provides a quick and compact reference to everything from aquinas five ways to prove the existence of god to the metaphysical possibilities of a zombie world

everyday arguments combines brief argument rhetoric with an anthology of illustrative readings drawn from arguments of everyday life the anthology of readings is closely tied to the principles and practices introduced in the rhetoric section the overarching philosophy of the reading selections and of the book as a whole is that written argument in all its variety is the most common form of writing and that much can be learned about its practice from the texts we encounter on a daily basis ideal for individuals interested in learning to develop argumentative and persuasive writing skills

the elements of arguments introduces such central critical thinking topics as informal fallacies the difference between validity and truth basic formal propositional logic and how to extract arguments from texts turetzky aims to prevent common confusions by clearly explaining a number of important distinctions including propositions vs propositional attitudes propositions vs states of affairs and logic vs rhetoric vs psychology exercises are provided throughout including numerous informal arguments that can be assessed using the skills and strategies presented within the text

the handbook of rational and social choice provides an overview of issues arising in work on the foundations of decision theory and

social choice over the past three decades drawing on work by economic theorists mainly but also with contributions from political science philosophy and psychology the collection shows how the related areas of decision theory and social choice have developed in their applications and moved well beyond the basic models of expected utility and utilitarian approaches to welfare economics containing twenty three contributions in many cases by leading figures in their fields the handbook shows how the normative foundations of economics have changed dramatically as more general and explicit models of utility and group choice have been developed this is perhaps the first time these developments have been brought together in a manner that seeks to identify and make accessible the recent themes and developments that have been of particular interest to researchers in recent years the collection will be of particular value to researchers in economics with interests in utility or welfare but it will also be of interest to any social scientist or philosopher interested in theories of rationality or group decision making

our beliefs come in degrees i m 70 confident it will rain tomorrow and 0 001 sure my lottery ticket will win what s more we think these degrees of belief should abide by certain principles if they are to be rational for instance you shouldn t believe that a person s taller than 6ft more strongly than you believe that they re taller than 5ft since the former entails the latter in dutch book arguments we try to establish the principles of rationality for degrees of belief by appealing to their role in guiding decisions in particular we show that degrees of belief that don t satisfy the principles will always guide action in some way that is bad or undesirable in this element we present dutch book arguments for the principles of probabilism conditionalization and the reflection principle among others and we formulate and consider the most serious objections to them

how strongly should you believe the various propositions that you can express that is the key question facing bayesian epistemology subjective bayesians hold that it is largely though not entirely up to the agent as to which degrees of belief to adopt objective bayesians on the other hand maintain that appropriate degrees of belief are largely though not entirely determined by the agent s evidence this book states and defends a version of objective bayesian epistemology according to this version objective bayesianism is characterized by three norms probability degrees of belief should be probabilities calibration they should be calibrated with evidence equivocation they should otherwise equivocate between basic outcomes objective bayesianism has been challenged on a number of different fronts for example some claim it is poorly motivated or fails to handle qualitative evidence or yields counter intuitive degrees of belief after updating or suffers from a failure to learn from experience it has also been accused of being computationally intractable susceptible to paradox language dependent and of not being objective enough especially suitable for graduates or researchers in philosophy of science foundations of statistics and artificial intelligence the book argues that these criticisms can be met and that objective bayesianism is a promising theory with an exciting agenda for further research

mark vorobej develops a novel approach to argument interpretation and evaluation that synthesizes subjective concerns about the personal points of view of individual arguers with objective concerns about the structural properties of arguments one of the key themes of the book is that we cannot succeed in distinguishing good arguments from bad arguments until we learn to listen carefully to others part i develops a relativistic account of argument cogency that allows for rational disagreement part ii offers a

comprehensive and rigorous account of argument diagramming

this book analyses the straw man fallacy and its deployment in philosophical reasoning while commonly invoked in both academic dialogue and public discourse it has not until now received the attention it deserves as a rhetorical device scott aikin and john casey propose that straw manning essentially consists in expressing distorted representations of one's critical interlocutor to this end the straw man comprises three dialectical forms and not only the one that is usually suggested the straw man the weak man and the hollow man moreover they demonstrate that straw manning is unique among fallacies as it has no particular logical form in itself because it is an instance of inappropriate meta argument or argument about arguments they discuss the importance of the onlooking audience to the successful deployment of the straw man reasoning that the existence of an audience complicates the dialectical boundaries of argument providing a lively provocative and thorough analysis of the straw man fallacy this book will appeal to postgraduates and researchers alike working in a range of fields including fallacies rhetoric argumentation theory and informal logic

a new pragmatic approach based on the latest developments in argumentation theory analyzing appeal to expert opinion as a form of argument reliance on authority has always been a common recourse in argumentation perhaps never more so than today in our highly technological society when knowledge has become so specialized as manifested for instance in the frequent appearance of expert witnesses in courtrooms when is an appeal to the opinion of an expert a reasonable type of argument to make and when does it become a fallacy this book provides a method for the evaluation of these appeals in everyday argumentation specialized domains of knowledge such as science medicine law and government policy have gradually taken over as the basis on which many of our rational decisions are made daily consequently appeal to expert opinion in these areas has become a powerful type of argument challenging an argument based on expert scientific opinion for example has become as difficult as it once was to question religious authority walton stresses that even in cases where expert opinion is divided the effect of it can still be so powerful that it

overwhelms an individual's ability to make a decision based on personal deliberation of what is right or wrong in a given situation. The book identifies the requirements that make an appeal to expert opinion a reasonable or unreasonable argument. Walton's new pragmatic approach analyzes that appeal as a distinctive form of argument with an accompanying set of appropriate critical questions matching the form throughout the book. A historical survey of the key developments in the evolution of the argument from authority dating from the time of the ancients is given and new light is shed on current problems of junk science and battles between experts in legal argumentation.
