and early 1960s filmmakers such as Juan Antonio Bardem, Luis García Berlanga and Luis Buñuel expressed a liberal image of Spain to the world in such films as *Muerte de un ciclista* (Death of a Cyclist), *Bienvenido señor Marshall* (Welcome Mr Marshall) and *Viridiana*. The emergence of new directors continued into the sixties and seventies with Carlos Saura, José Luis Borau, Víctor Erice and others.
